

LOUIS CUNY. A very fine George II Milk Jug made in London in 1730 by Louis Cuny.

Description

The Jug is of the footed baluster type, standing on an applied circular foot decorated with reeding. The main body has a plain baluster form and rises to an everted neck and shaped spout and rim, applied to the main body as a separate section. The scroll handle has a leaf capped top and tri-furcated moulding where it is attached at the top. The front is finely engraved with an armorial surrounded by a foliate scroll cartouche.

The Jug is in excellent condition, has a fine colour and is of a good gauge and weight. This example is fully marked in the foot. The arms are those of Dickinson or Dicconson, as they are the only ones with a Fess Ermine in the middle. If so it is specified to the branches at Cleypole in Lincolnshire, Bradley in Staffordshire and "co. Yorkshire". Height: 3.9 inches, 9.75 cm.Length, spout to handle: 9.5 cm.Weight: 4.75 oz.
